

The leading cause of deaths and severe injuries in northeastern Minnesota include:

- * Alcohol,
- Distraction,
- Speed and
- Lack of Seatbelt use.



The leading type of crash resulting in deaths and severe injuries include:

- * Run-off-Road
- **❖** Intersection-related
