A. Navigating the DWI eCharging & eWarrants Process (1:30-2:45 p.m.)

Geared towards law enforcement, this session covers the arrests of impaired drivers. Learn what's new with DWI eCharging, electronic search warrants and the DWI dashboard. And, coming this spring, is eWarrants – which allows an officer to do electronic warrants in less time.

In addition, the DWI Dashboard shows mapping of DWIs, along with severe injuries and fatal crashes, so law enforcement can see where they should focus their resources.
