Life Link III's OneLink<sup>™</sup> connects a mobile device, tablet or desktop computer directly to the Life Link III Communication Center to request an aircraft when critical care transport is necessary. All transport requests are transferred immediately to Life Link III's computer aided dispatch (CAD) system to get the request initiated as quickly as possible—when time is of the essence and the patient condition is critical.
