10:45 a.m. Shattered Dreams: Distracted Driving Changes Lives

Trooper Jeff Stearns, Minnesota State Patrol, District 2300; Chris Weber, distracted driver Andrea Boeve and her two young daughters were biking near their family farm when a distracted driver changed everything. On June 30, 2014, 33-year-old Andrea was struck and killed and her daughters were seriously injured because a driver's eyes were on his phone and not on the road. "I was a 26-year-old loving life, two kids – and then I made that bad choice," said Chris Weber, "that choice I can't take back and I killed someone because of it." Weber, who pled guilty to criminal vehicular homicide, served six months in jail in 2015 and will serve
