




According to Rick West, Otter Tail County engineer:

Established Statewide Trauma System





Pre- and Post-TZD

Aeromedical Auto Launch

- Automatically launches helicopter when 911 call received
- Don't wait for responders to arrive on scene
- Reduces helicopter response time





DWI Courts



Lowers the rate of repeat offenders from 31-78 percent!



Point of Impact Teen Driver Safety Parent Awareness Classes

- In 2012-2013, DPS OTS piloted the POI program and evaluated changes in parental knowledge in understanding teen driving risks & laws.
- Pre- and post-class parent surveys showed a 38% increase in knowledge of the laws (pre survey: 36%; post-survey: 74%)
- Evaluation results:
 - 99% of parents will use info to help their teen:
 - 98.5% of parents would recommend the class to other parents of teen drivers











Enforcement

- Highly Visible

Driver License Sanctions: Ignition Interlock

The number of impaired (BAC ≥ 0.08%) drivers in fatal crashes falls

When states require interlocks for repeat offenders only

when states require interlocks for repeat offenders and first offenders with high BACs

16% when states require interlocks for all DUI offenders, including first offenders

- 2011: MN Advanced Rider Courses
- 2012: MN Expert Rider Courses
- Added Trainings: 3-Wheel, Moped, Road Guard, Skills Re-test, etc.

1986: 375 Students

Through 2017: 169,740 students in all courses






