

The Southwest Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) program began in 2007. The counties involved include: Big Stone, Chippewa, Kandiyohi, Lac qui Parle, Lincoln, Lyon, McLeod, Meeker, Murray, Pipestone, Redwood, Renville, Swift and Yellow Medicine. The leading cause of deaths and severe injuries in southwest Minnesota include:

- Lack of Seatbelt Use
- Impaired Driving
- Speed and Aggressive Driving
- Inattentive Driving

The leading type of crash resulting in deaths and severe injuries include:

- Run-off-Road
- Intersection-Related
