Law Enforcement Changes


Ø Officers agreed that an underage drinking party needed to be treated as a crime scene.

Ø Officers know that their goal at an underage drinking party was to find out where the alcohol came from.

Furnishing Alcohol Proposed Recommendations

- Ø Arrested and booked
- Ø Mandatory court appearance/PSI
- Ø Serve 30 days in jail or 60 days home monitor
- Ø 180 days in jail, stayed
- Ø 2 years probation
- Ø Chemical evaluation with CDC and follow recommendations
- Ø No use of alcohol or other mood altering substances
- ø \$120 probation fee and \$900 court reimbursement fee, plus \$203 in costs or 22 days STS

Best Practices

- Ø The City Council supports a voluntary Best Practices Program. The programs purpose is to encourage liquor license holders to voluntarily undertake practices that will help avoid sales to underage buyers. A licensed establishment that participates in the program will be subject to a modified schedule of presumptive penalties.

Incentives to discourage sale to underage buyers

- All people who sell or deliver alcoholic beverages should check the identification of anyone who appears to be 40 years old or younger. If a liquor licensee wishes to make this a requirement in its establishment, the City will provide notices to be posted.
- Ø Incidents that can be verified by the Police Department, the City will provide a reward of \$50 to a person who:
 - checks identification,
 - discovers an underage person attempting to purchase alcoholic beverages,
 - and cooperates with the City in attempting to obtain a conviction.

Social Host Ordinance Positives

- Ø Helps to provide safe environment for adolescents and children,
- Ø Helps deter alcohol use among underage drinkers,
- Ø Helps to prevent DUI and related accidents, injuries and loss of life,
- Ø Helps to prevent acquaintance rape, and other alcohol related violence,
- Ø Helps to save taxpayer's money through decreased burden of payment of treatment and other social services,
- Ø Helps to send the proper message that we as a community value the lives our young people!

Social Host ORDINANCE 120, 3d Introduced by Councilor Marin

Purpose and Findings. Discourage underage possession and consumption of alcohol, even if done within the confines of a private residence, and intends to hold persons criminally responsible who host events or gatherings where persons under twenty-one (21) years of age possess or consume alcohol regardless of whether the person hosting the event or gathering supplied the alcohol.

Prohibit Acts

Ø It is unlawful to:

- Host or allow an event or gathering (3 or more),
- Residence, premise, private or public property,
- Where alcohol or alcoholic beverages are present,
- When the person knows or reasonably should know that an underage person will or does consume any alcohol or,
- Underage person possess any alcohol with intent to consume,
- The host person fails to take preventative s

A person is criminally responsible if

Ø They intentionally aid, advise, hire, counsel, or conspire with others to commit the act.



A person who hosts the event

Ø Or gathering does not have to be present at the event to be responsible.



Exceptions

- Ø Underage person with parents solely at parent's household,
- Ø Legally protected religious observances,
- ø Employment purposes,
- Ø Retail intoxicating liquor or 3.2% malt liquor licer

Penalty

Social Host - Violation of this ordinance is a *Misdemeanor*,
 Adult Provider - GROSS MISDEMEANOR.
